The IB Middle Years Programme is designed for those students who “love to learn” and are ready for an academic challenge. It encourages students to make connections between their learning and the real world, while helping them become critical, creative, and reflective thinkers. With a five-year programme partnering with Jones High School, the MYP extends through 10<sup>th</sup>-grade with a seamless transition to the IB Diploma Programme for students seeking the more rigorous high school courses.

- Thinking


### International-Mindedness
